PLAYERS GUILD - THURSDAY, JANUARY 16

The year is off to an intriguing start as Roseanna Bellino-Strickland directs some thought-provoking drama in a new Reader's Theatre on Thursday, January 16 at 7:30 PM in the AR. Actors will read scenes and sketches from these famous plays: The *Glass Menagerie, Inherit the Wind, Come Back, Little Sheba*, and T*he Matchmaker.* In Tennessee Williams' 1944 Pulitzer Prize- winning *Glass Menagerie,* the author tells the story of a family in St Louis during The Great Depression based on Williams, his mentally fragile sister, not to mention his lively and attention-seeking mother. You will probably remember that with *Inherit the Wind,* the authors Jerome Lawrence and Robert E. Lee based their play loosely on the1925 Scopes "Monkey" Trial in which a Tennessee high school science teacher was accused of teaching Charles Darwin's theory of evolution which was against the law in Tennessee at that time. *Come Back, Little Sheba* by William Inge is a 1950 play which focuses on marital frustration that "erupts in violence" particularly when a young female student moves in as a boarder around the same time that the family's dog is lost. *The Matchmaker*, a 1954 work of Thorton Wilder, is a re-write of his 1938 *The Merchant of Yonkers*. The revision included boosting Dolly Levi to a main character who is hired as a matchmaker by a local merchant Horace Vandergelder. Then the merriment ensues, and everyone ends up with a perfect match. The cast includes Rosanna Brown, Rich Dawson, Melanie Eastman, Julius Hirsch, Denise Pepper, Lorie Richards, Mike Sternfeld, and Macey Zarit. The director is Ms. Bellino-Strickland; the Assistant Director is Judie Mc Askill while Joyce Belcher will produce.
